Remember Us fully co-operates with the relevant statutory authorities in relation to young people/vulnerable adults protection and welfare matters.

We adopt safe practices and a Code of Behaviour to minimise the possibility of harm or accidents happening to young people/vulnerable adults and protect staff and volunteers from the need to take unnecessary risks that may leave themselves open to accusation of abuse or neglect.

Remember Us has procedures to keep children/vulnerable adults safe when they are using our services, in line with the Children First Act 2015. All our staff and volunteers are trained in how to respond to child protection concerns.

Remember Us staff and volunteers who work with children/vulnerable adults and families are Garda vetted, qualified and receive supervision.

Remember Us fully respects confidentiality requirements in dealing with young person/vulnerable adult protection matters.

We listen to children/vulnerable adults and act on what they say.

We respond to all concerns as quickly as possible.
